WASH-IPC Task Force: Driving WASH FIT learning and scaling in Mali

Political Commitment – Ministry of Health leads the Task Force since 2015

- Coordination and monitoring IPC-WASH in HCF
- Defining WASH / IPC strategies and standards with WASH FIT as the flagship tool
- WASH FIT: Contextualisation and training of actors to harmonize the process across Mali
- Since 2018: Progressive Capitalisation, Learning & Replication of WASH FIT to 330 HCF


WASH FIT – Intervention Logic

- Initial Evaluation (DHIS2 / JMP indicators)
- 5 Etapes WASH FIT
- WASH Improvements (Plan)
- Advocacy / Governance
- Capitalisation/ Learning

2016 - 2022: MoH uses WASH FIT with support from WaterAid-One Drop-WHO; UNICEF, World Vision-IRC WASH, Terre des hommes

WASH FIT: An Efficient Tool for Essential Advocacy



- WASH FIT data facilitates the community (cleaners, women, leaders, etc.) to demand their rights to WASH
- Reinforces Trust between Authorities Health workers -Community.
- Reinforces community commitments to action



- Engages local decision makers to prioritise WASH in HCF in their plans
- Reinforces integrity and accountability of stakeholders
- Supports national advocacy

Accountability


 Community and HCF staff present WASH FIT plans at "town halls" and demand their right to WASH.

Commitments

Local leaders include WASH
FIT priorities in the 5-year
municipal plan. (PDSEC)

Actions (examples)

 HCF management committees (ASACO) and Municipalities purchase hygiene consumables and fully fund new toilet blocks.



Outcomes

- Improving WASH in HCF increased revenues and led to employment contracts for cleaners and new maintenance funds.

National Echo

 Local advocacy documents and WASH FIT outcomes are presented in Bamako and inform the new National WASH in HCF strategy.
